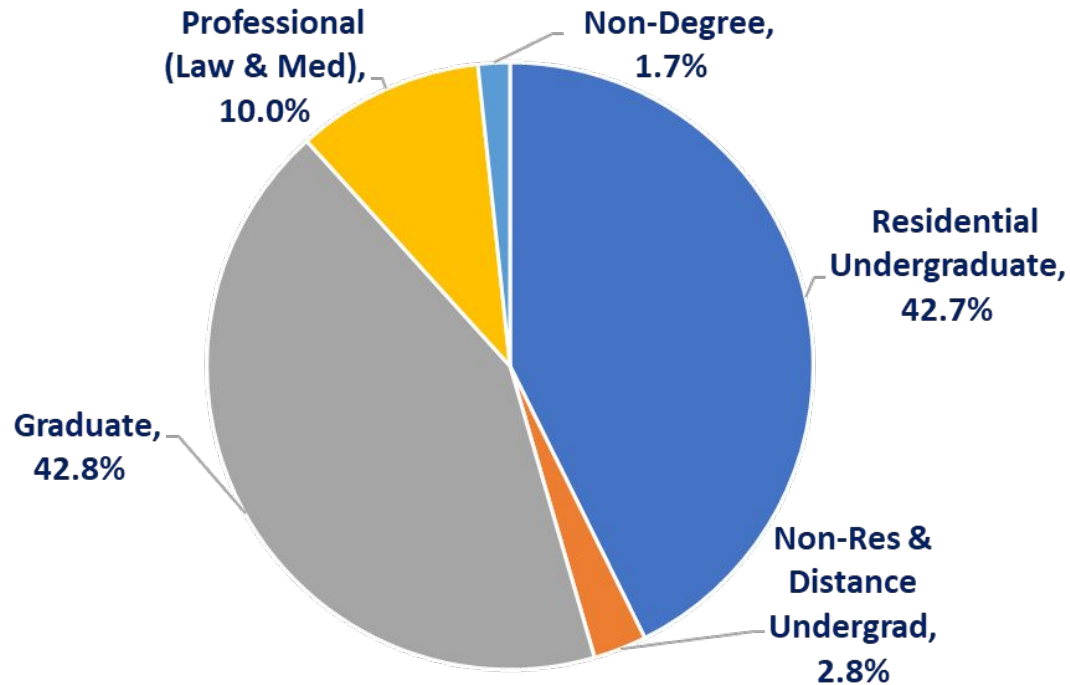

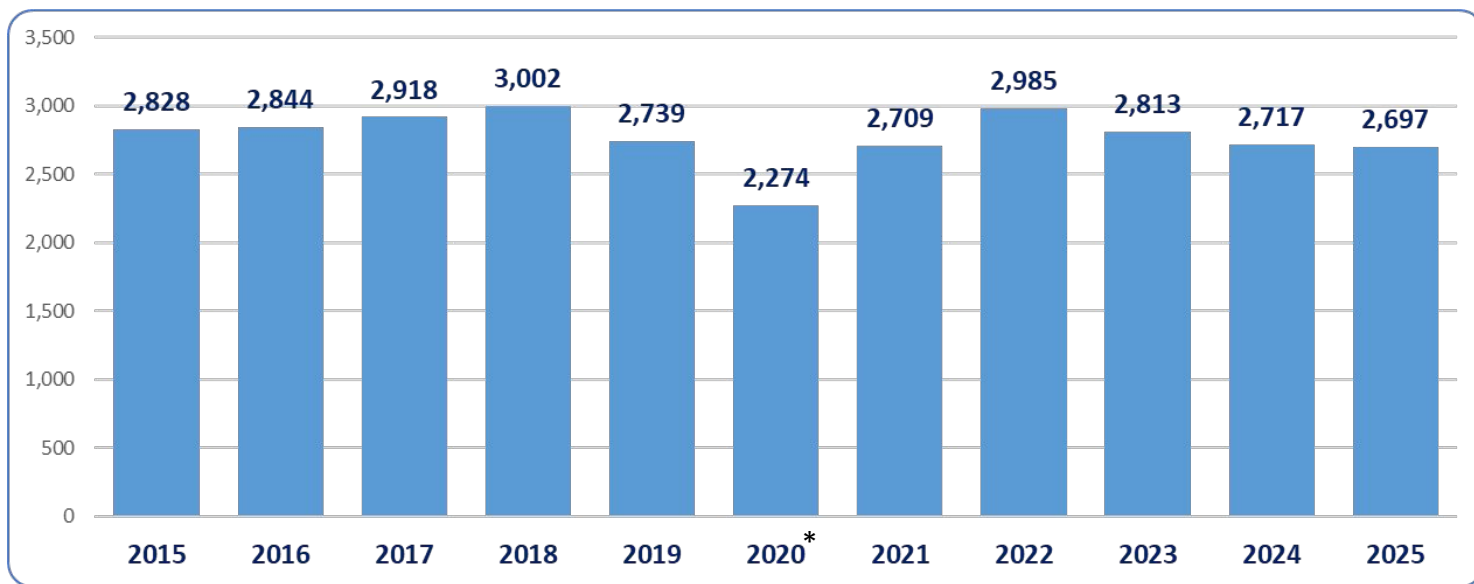

# New Residential Undergraduates: Fall First-Year and Transfers

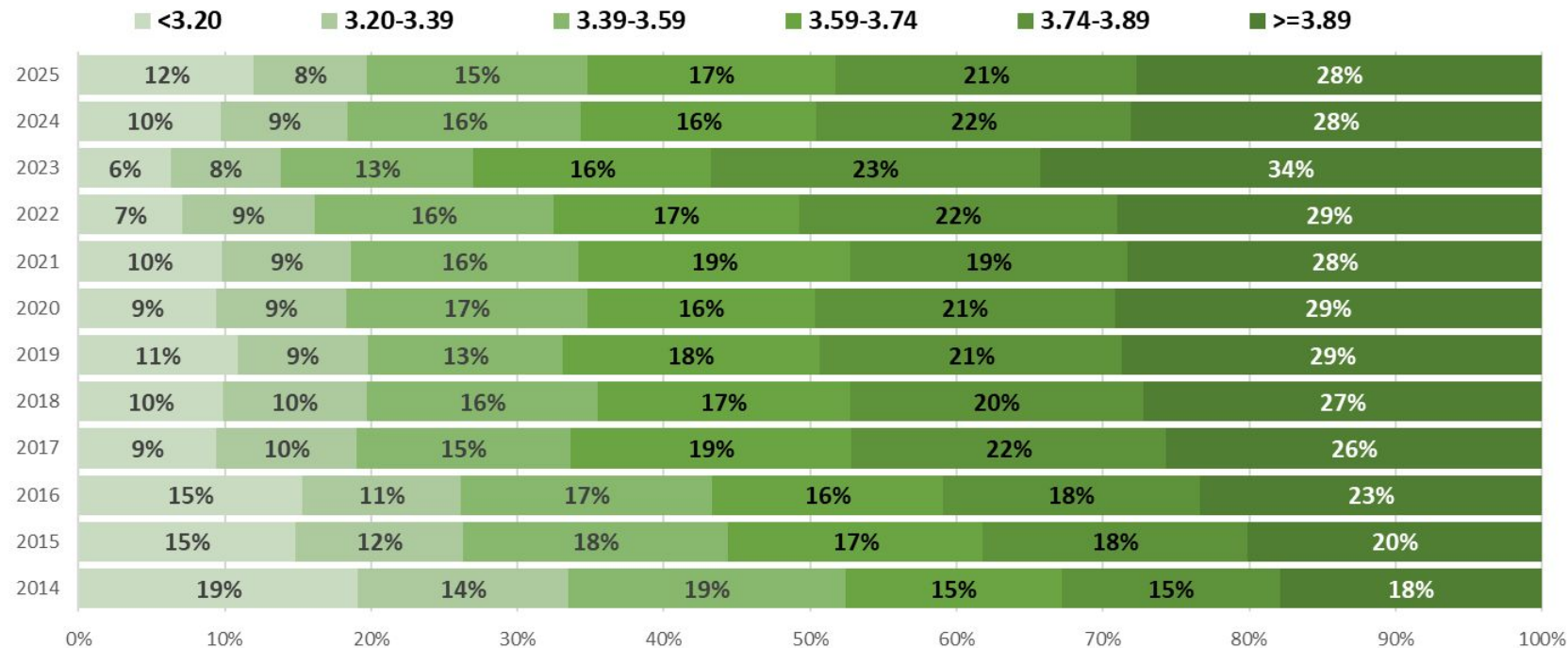

# Distribution of High School GPA for Fall First-Year Students\*

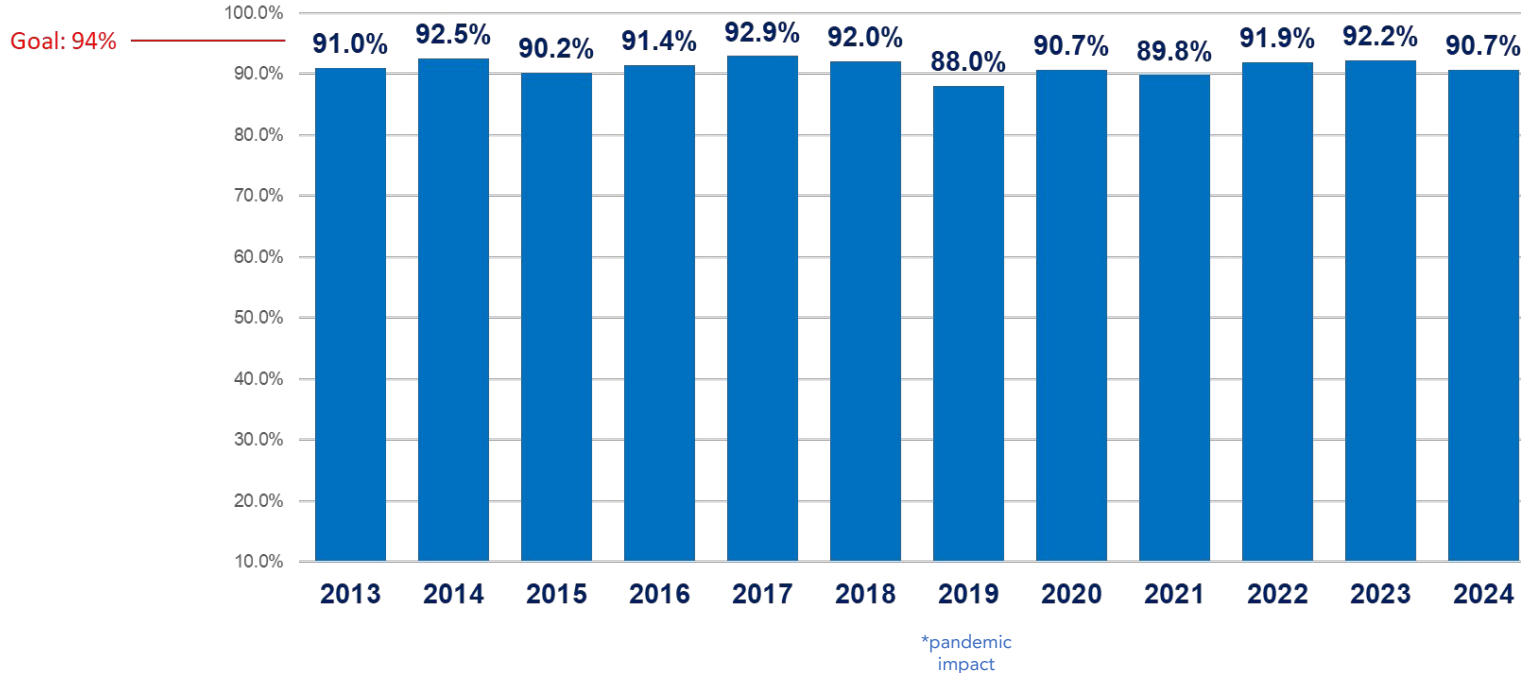

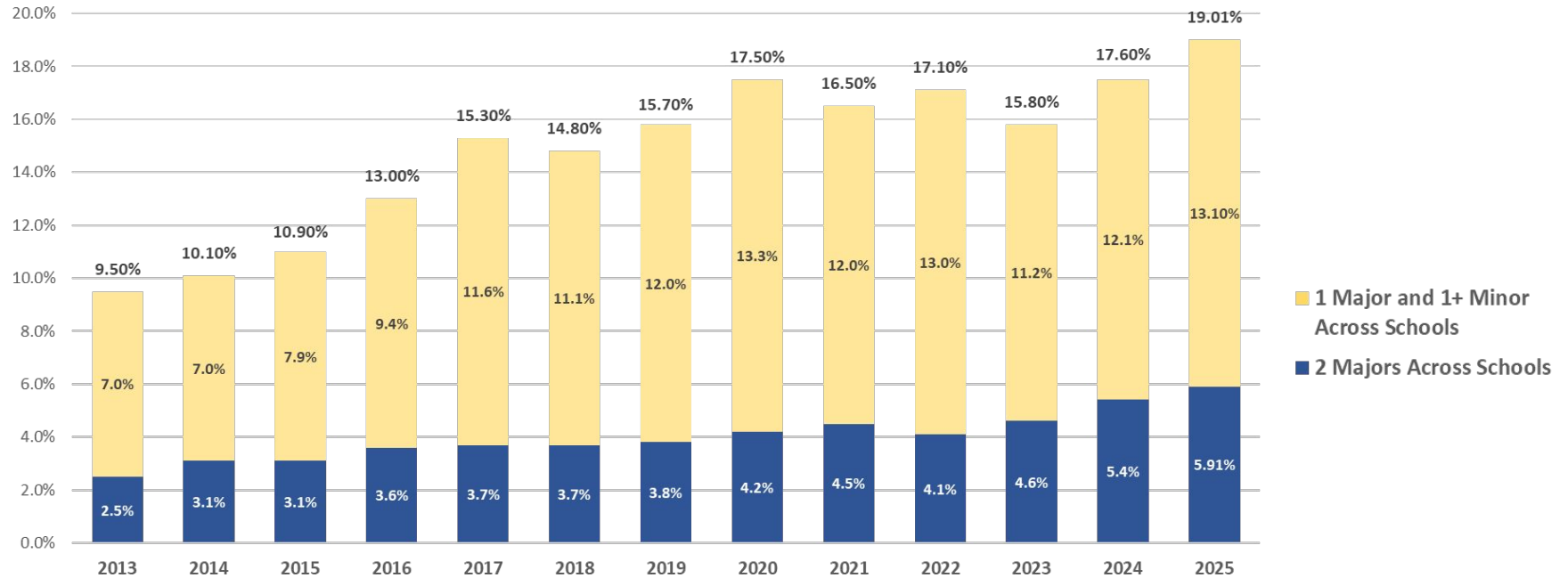
# First-Year Retention Rate, 2013-2024 Residential Cohort

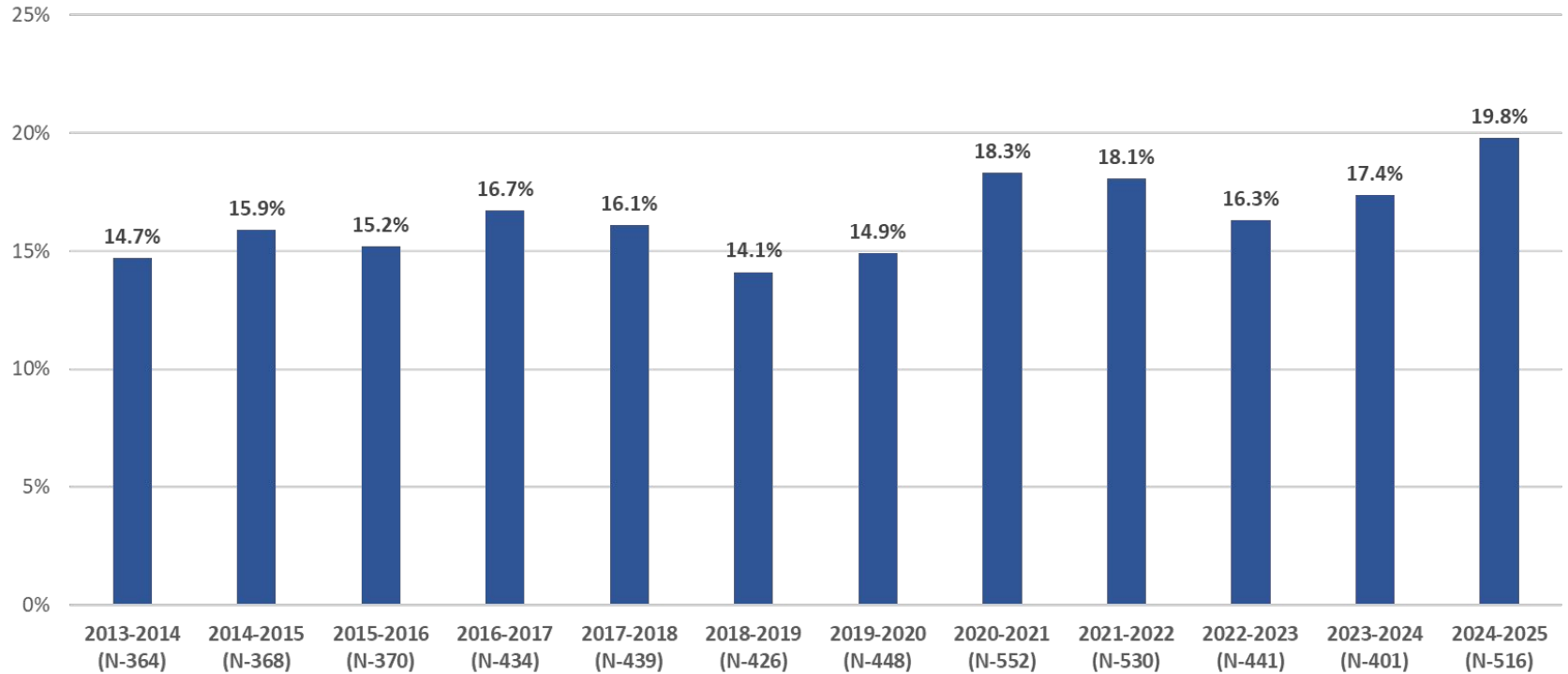

# Number and Percentage of Undergraduate Students in Residential Colleges with Majors or Minors in More than One School



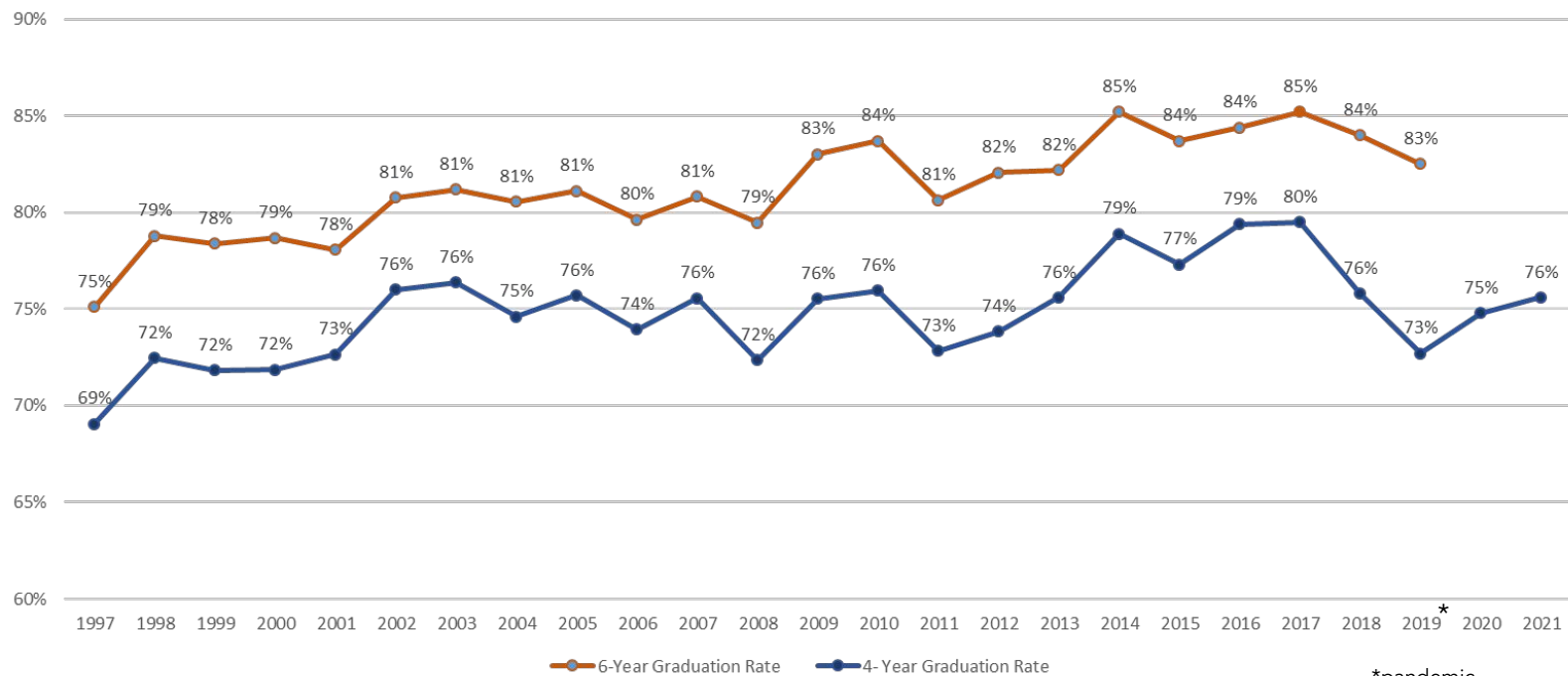

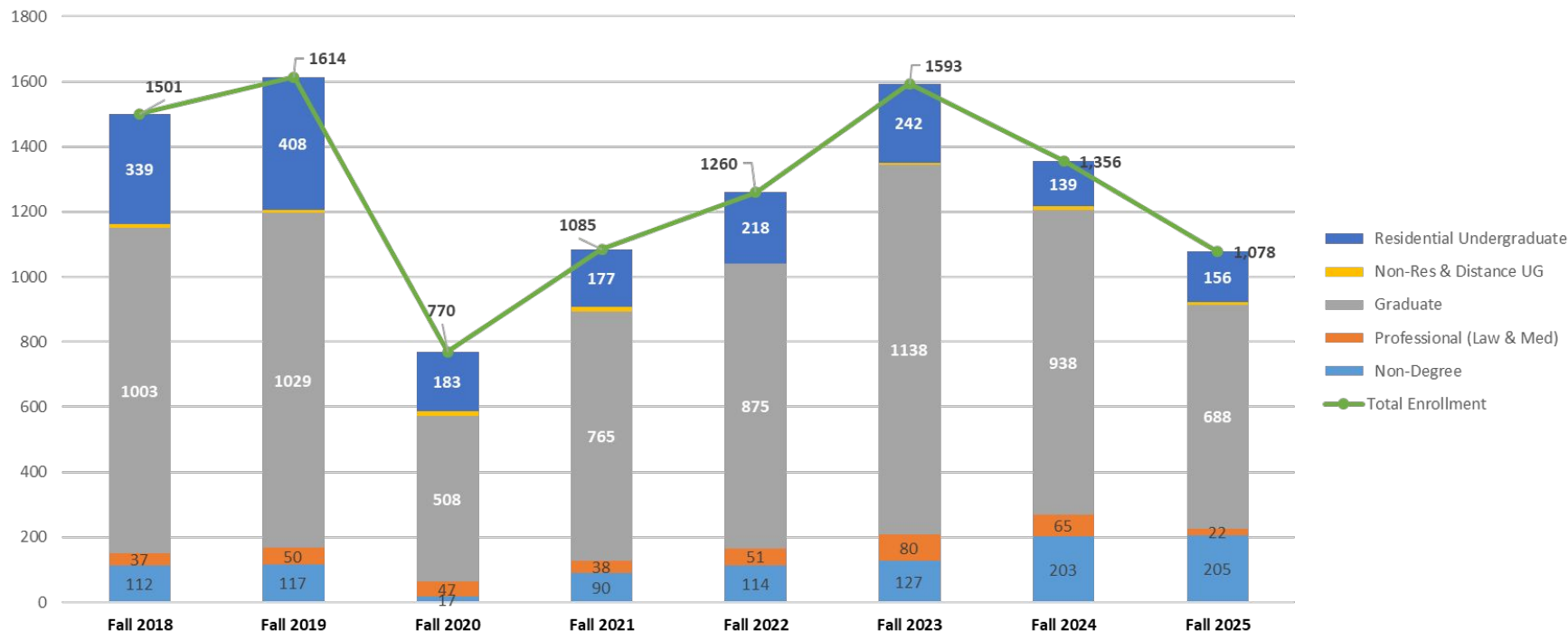

All Levels, All Countries: Fall 2018 – 2025

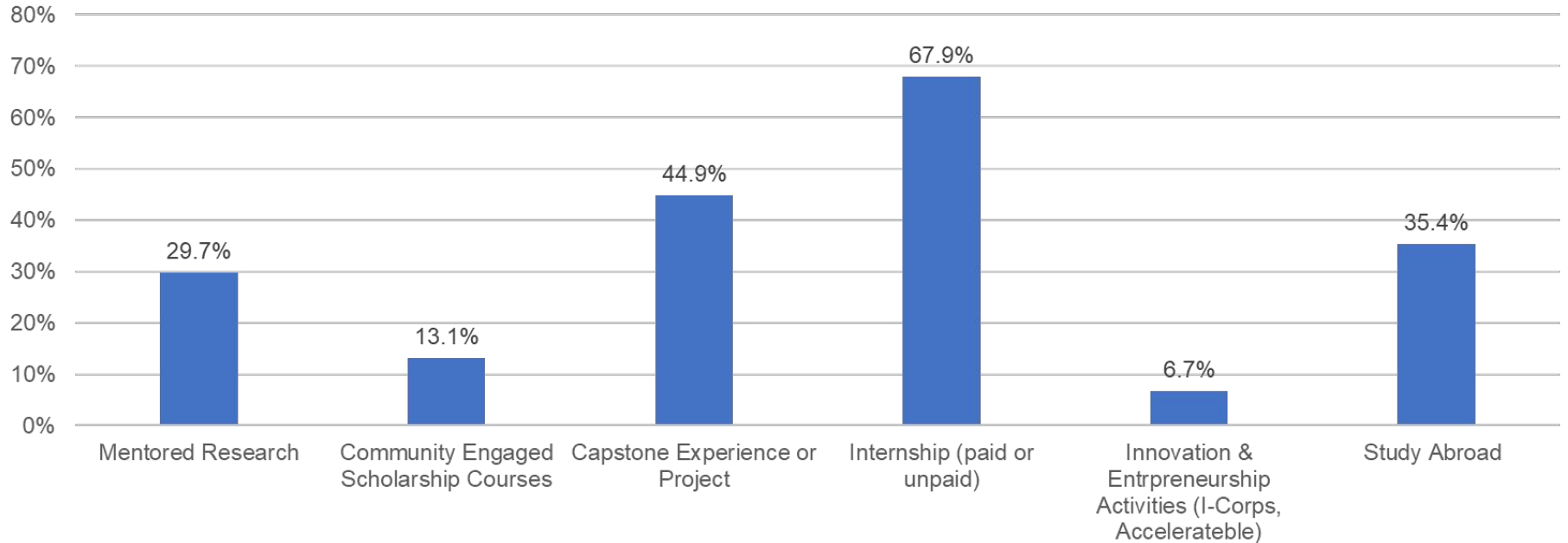

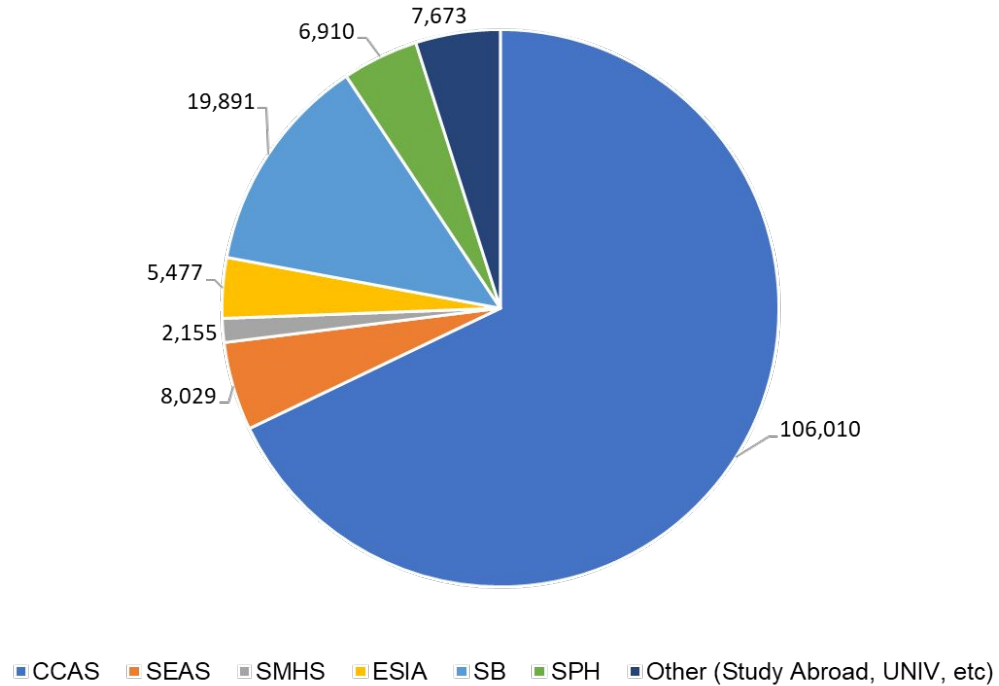

Fall 2025\*

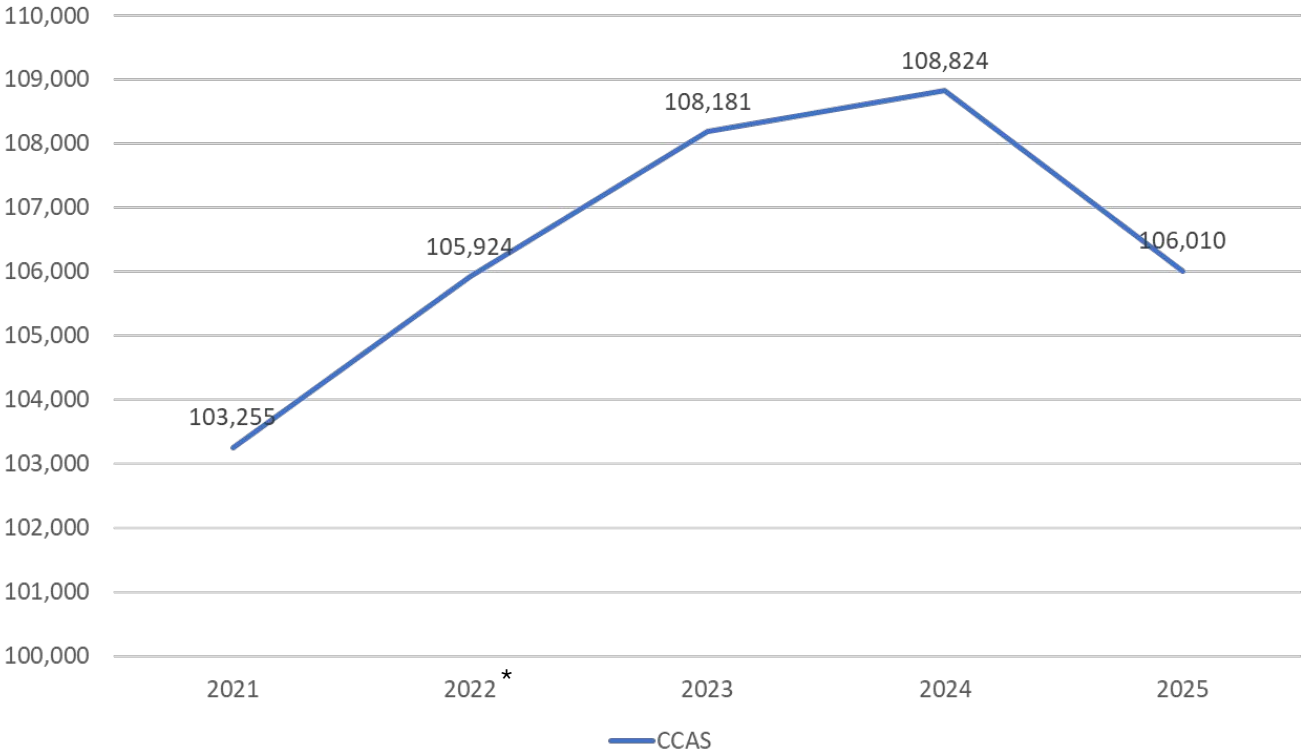

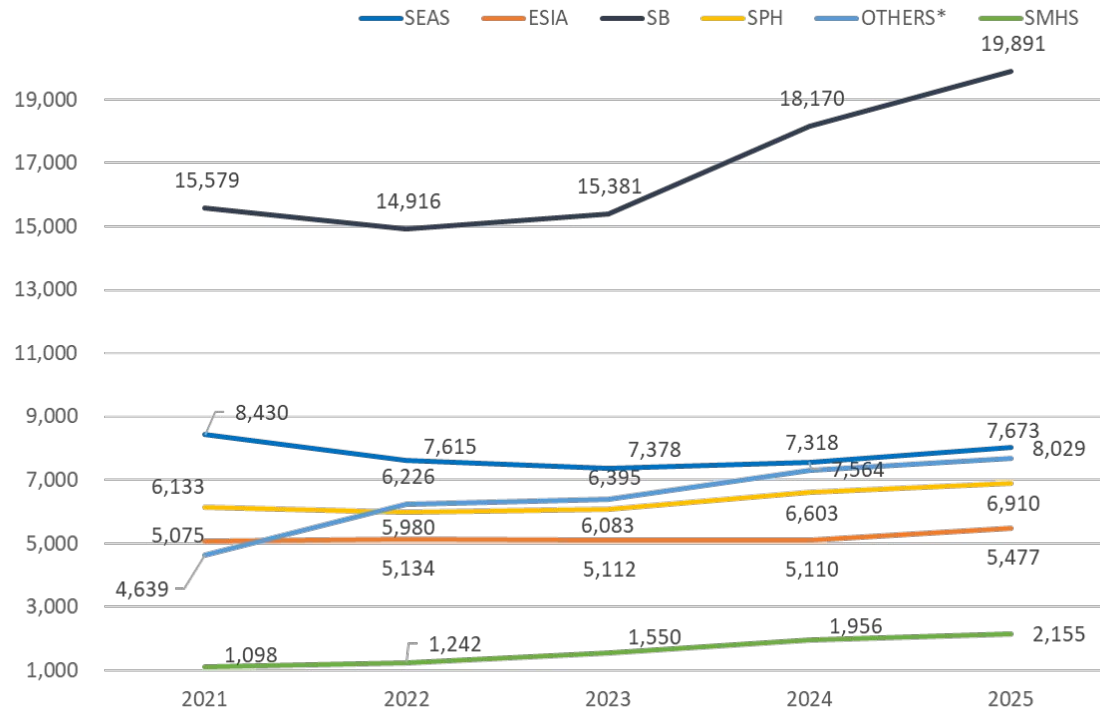

# Undergraduate Credit-Hour Trends for Non-CCAS Residential Schools

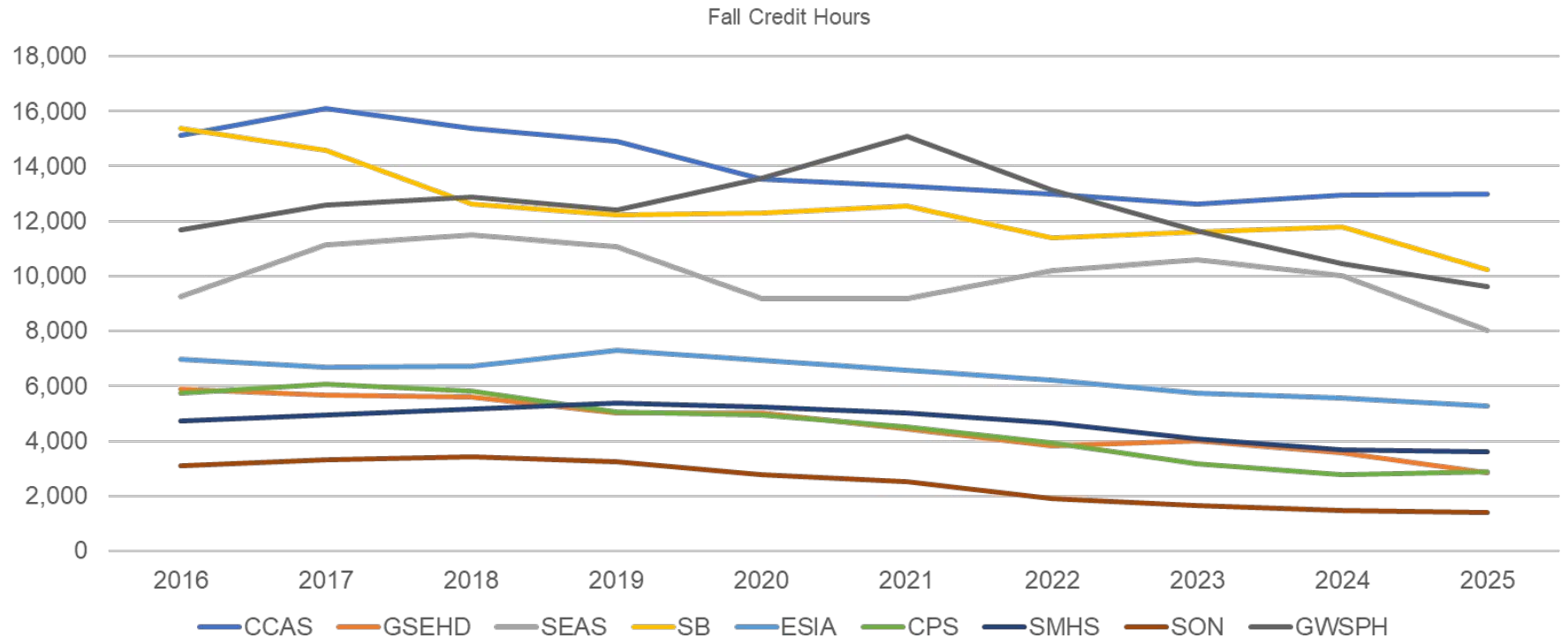

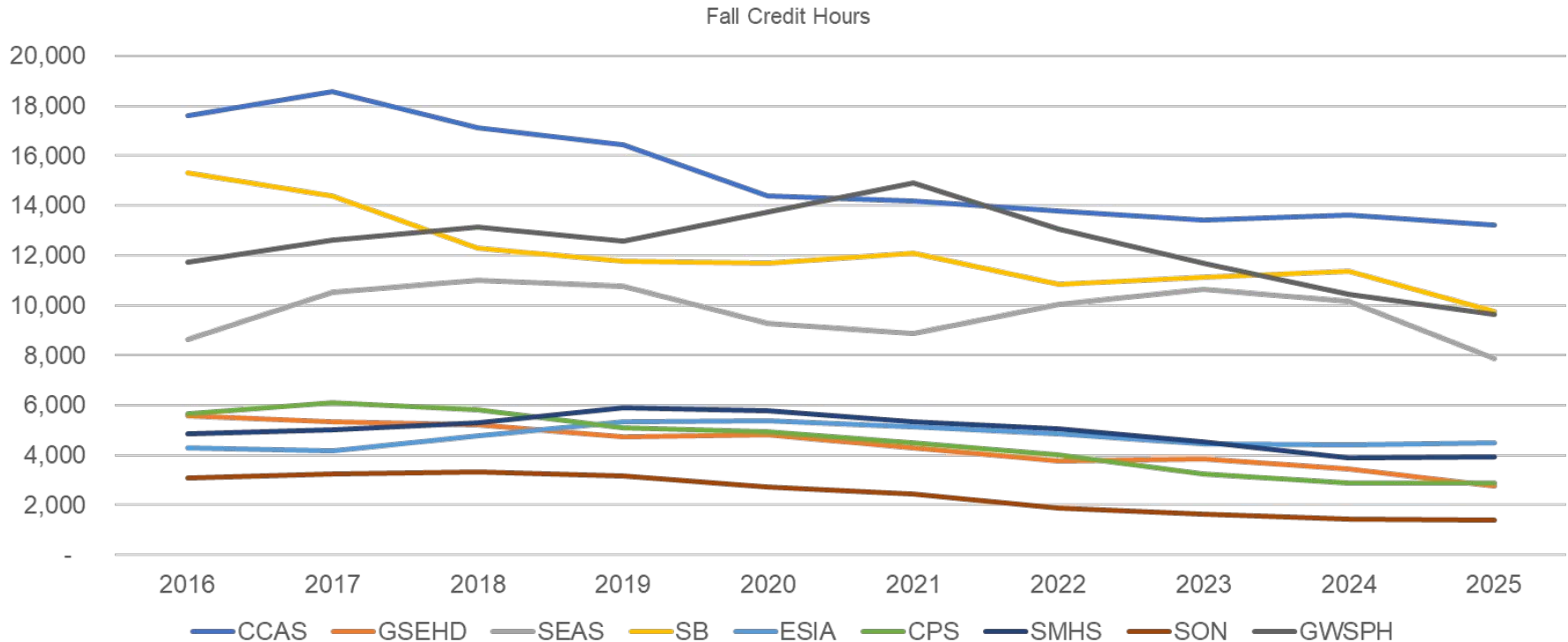

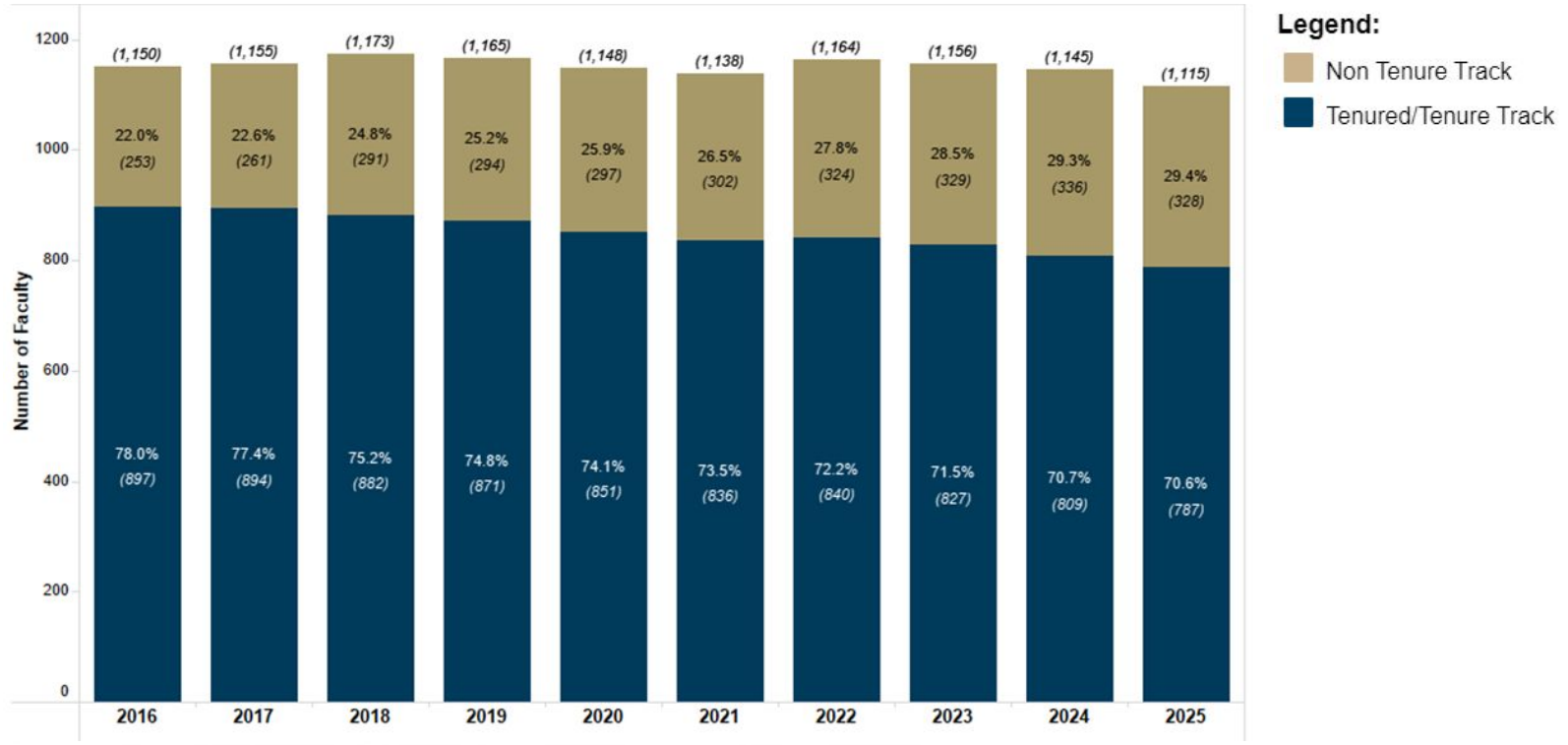
# Masters Credit Hours Taken by School of Instruction

# Number and Percentage of Regular Active Status Faculty by Tenure Status (MFA Not Included)

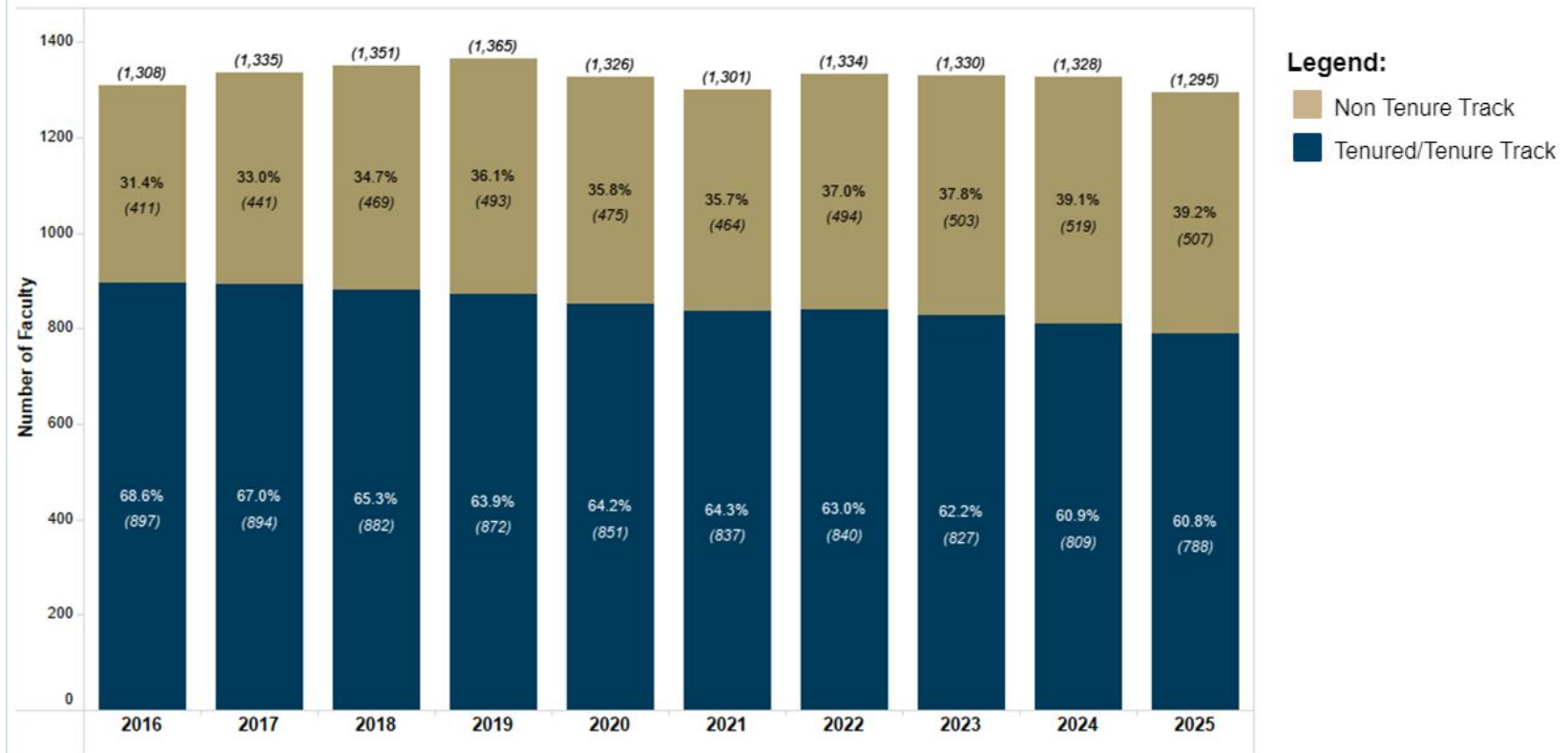

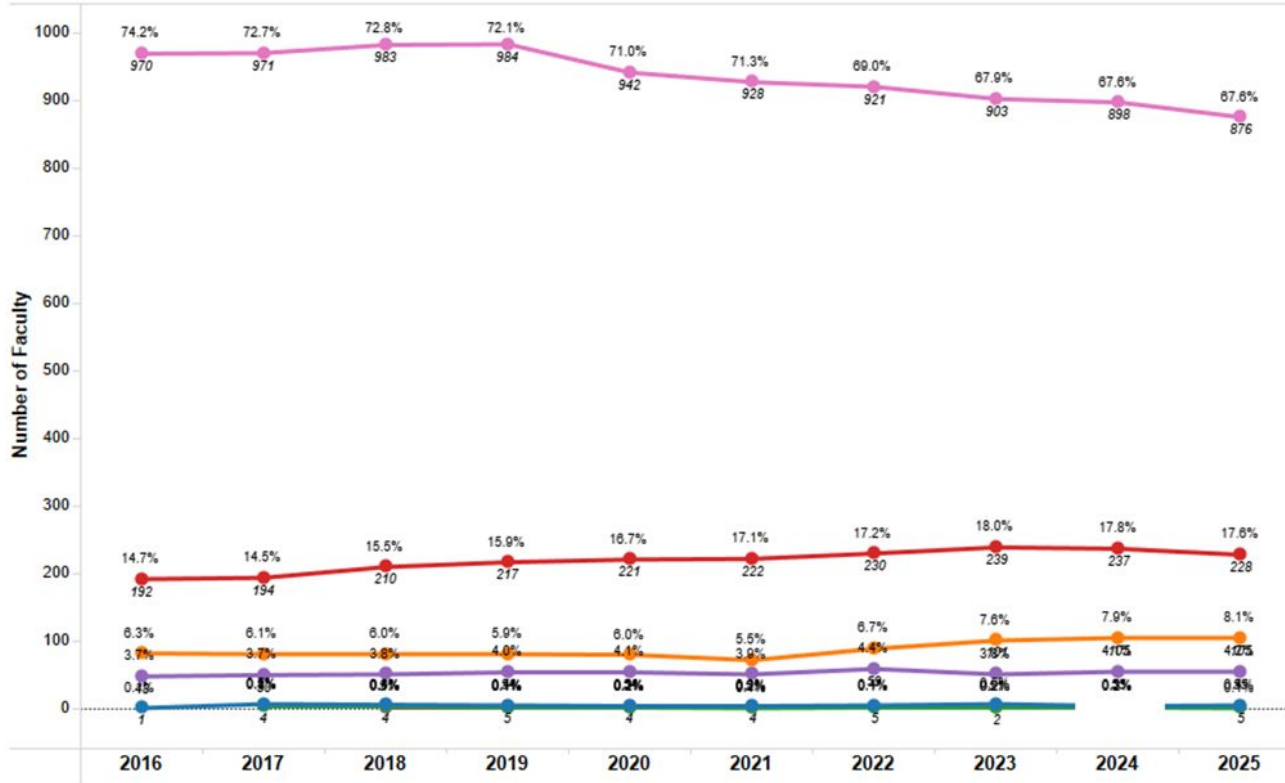
# Number and Percentage of Regular, Research, and Special Service Faculty by Tenure Status (MFA Not Included)



# Full-Time Faculty by Sex



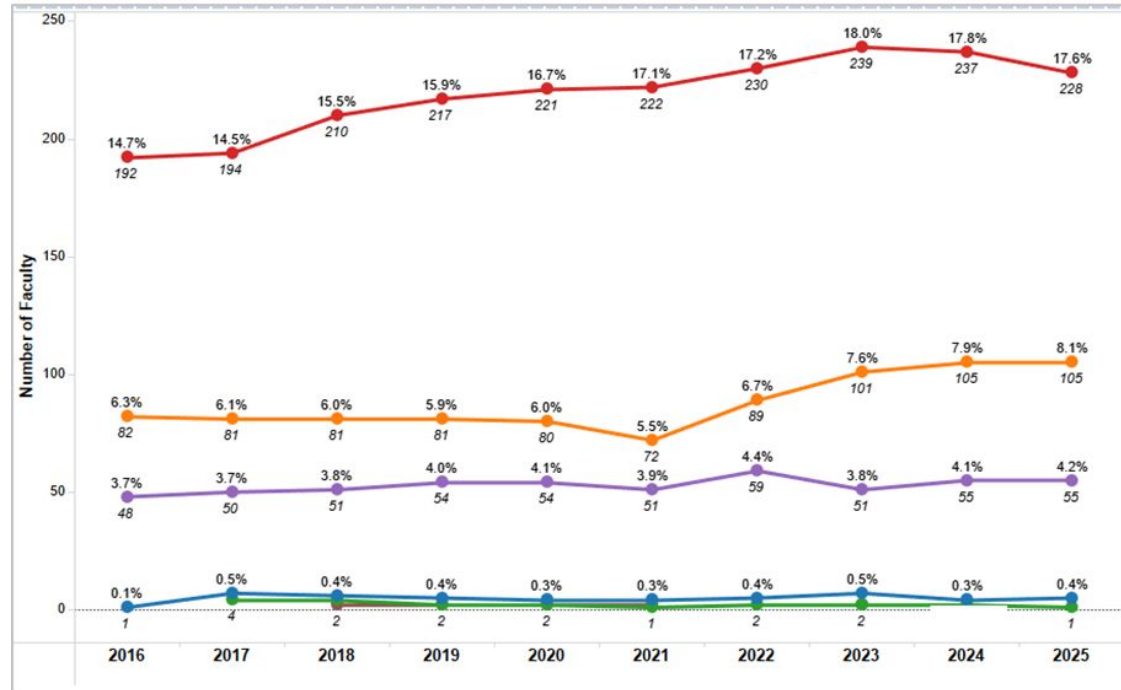
# Full-Time Faculty by Race/Ethnicity

# Full-Time Non-White Faculty by Race/Ethnicity

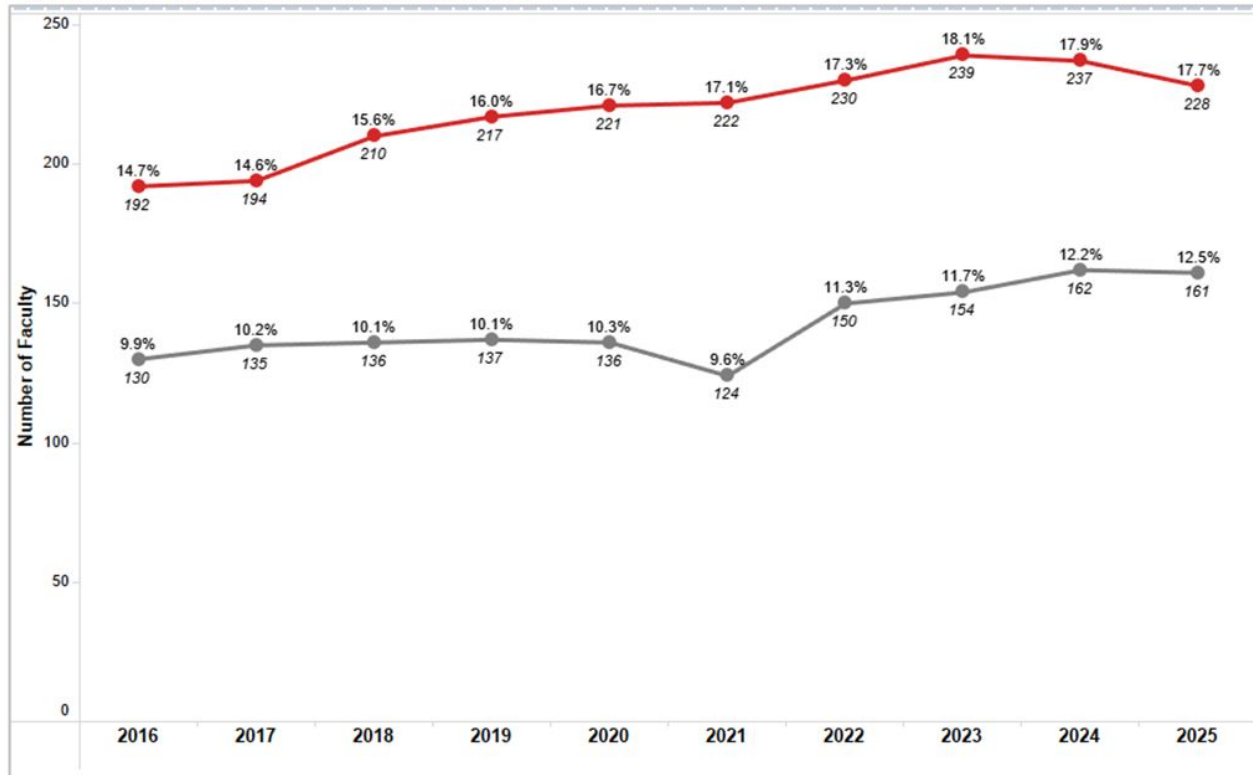

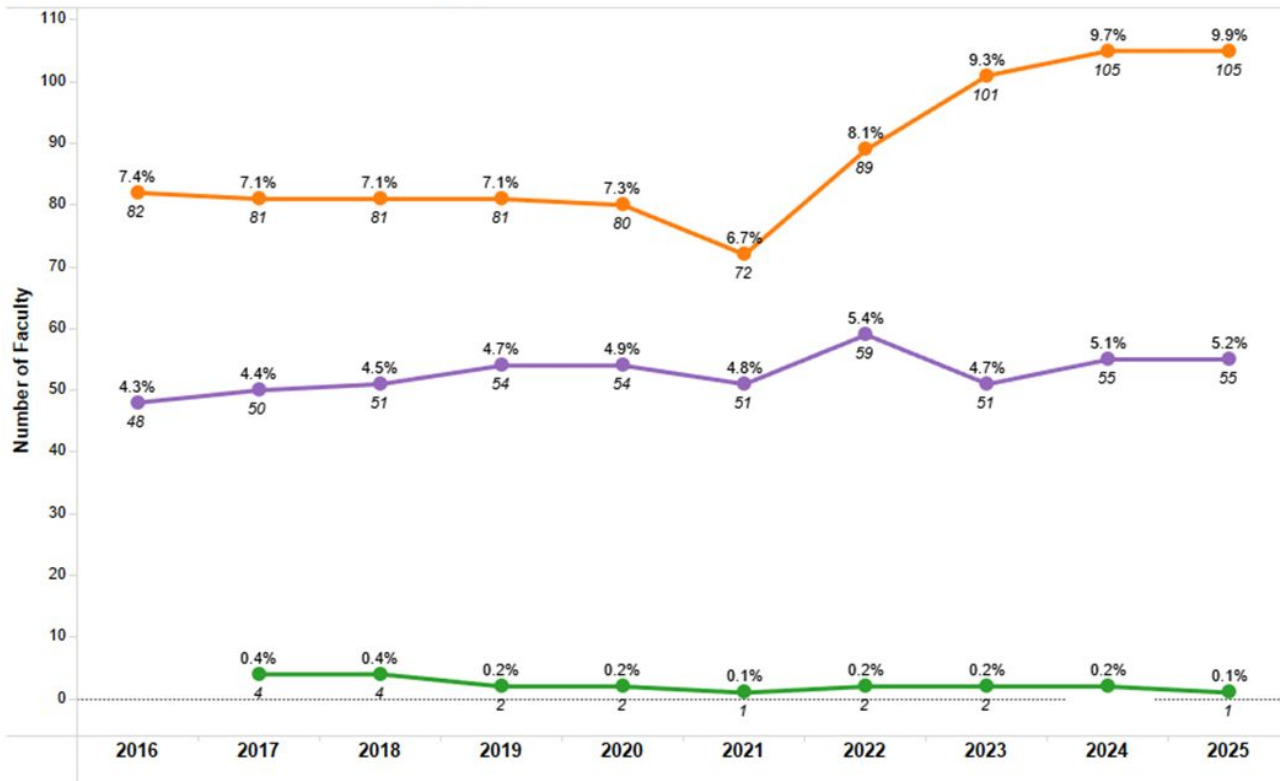
# Full-Time Asian and URM Faculty

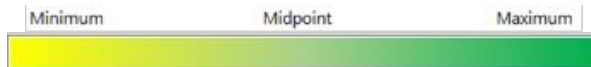

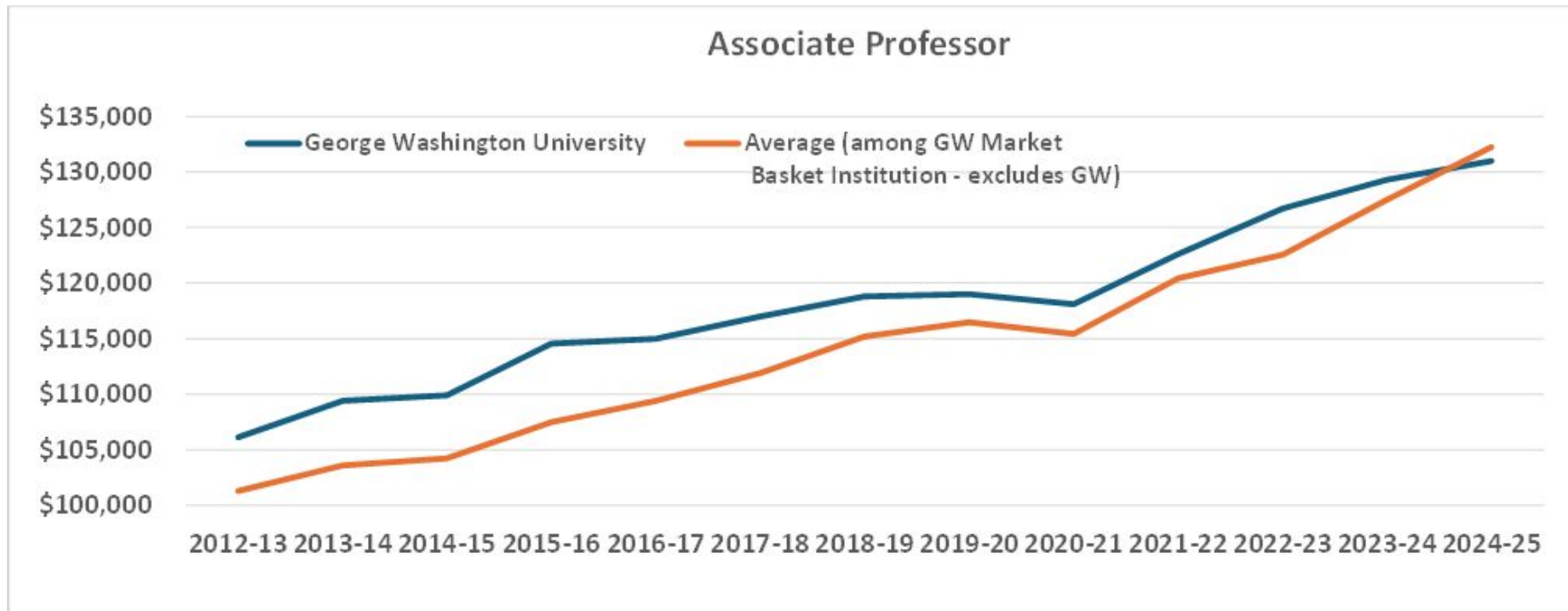

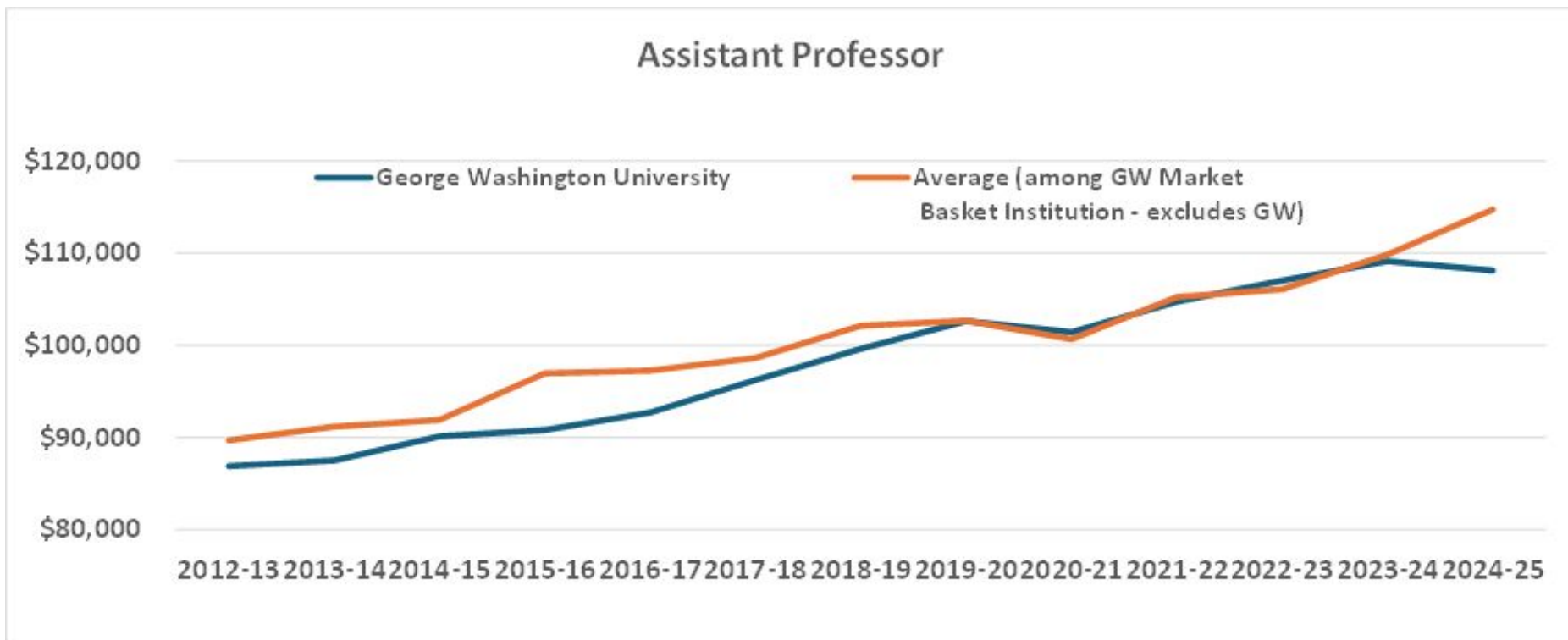

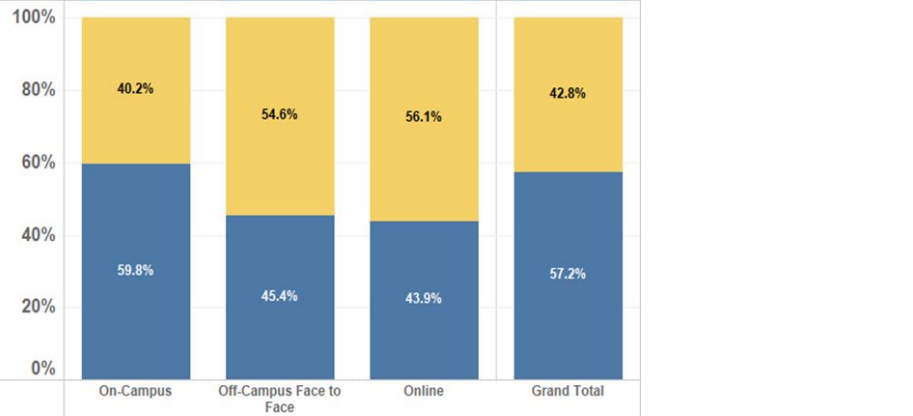
# Full- and Part-Time Faculty Teaching\* by Campus

% of Course Sections Taught by Full/Part-Time Faculty



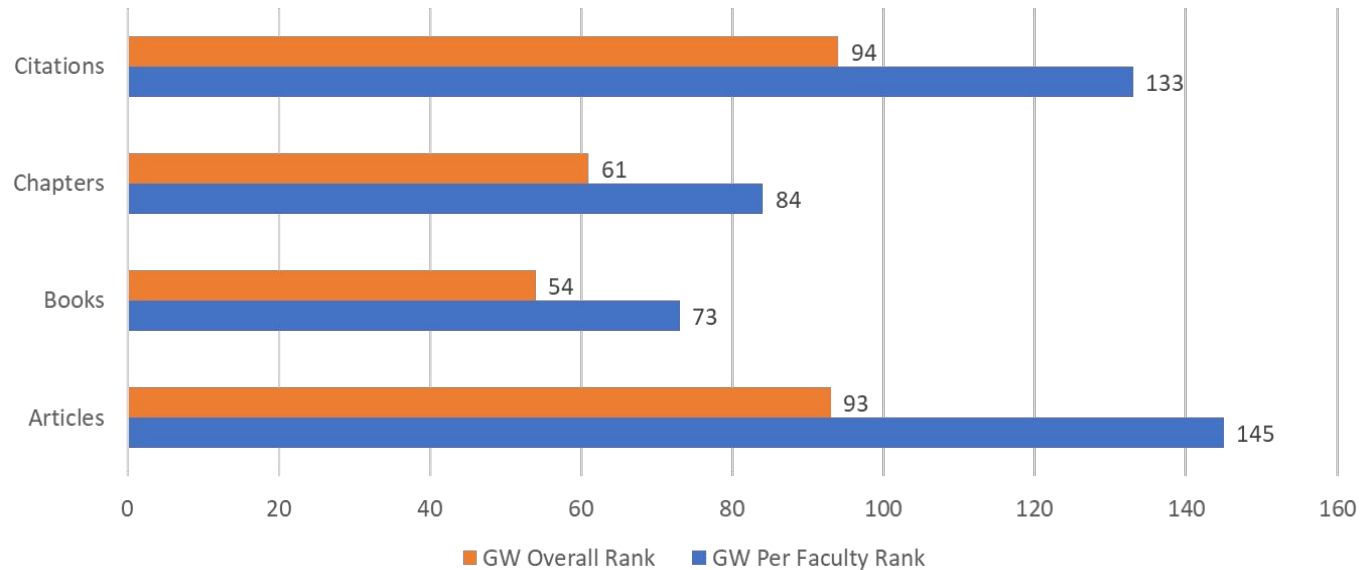

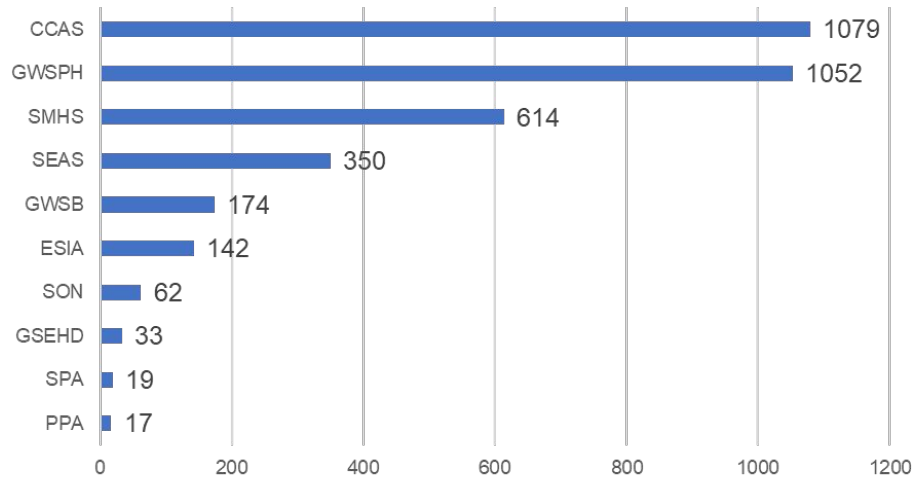

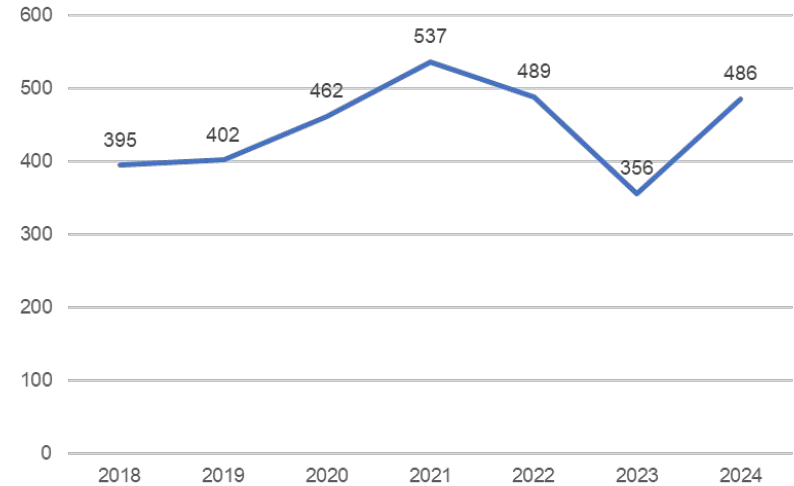

Publications by Year



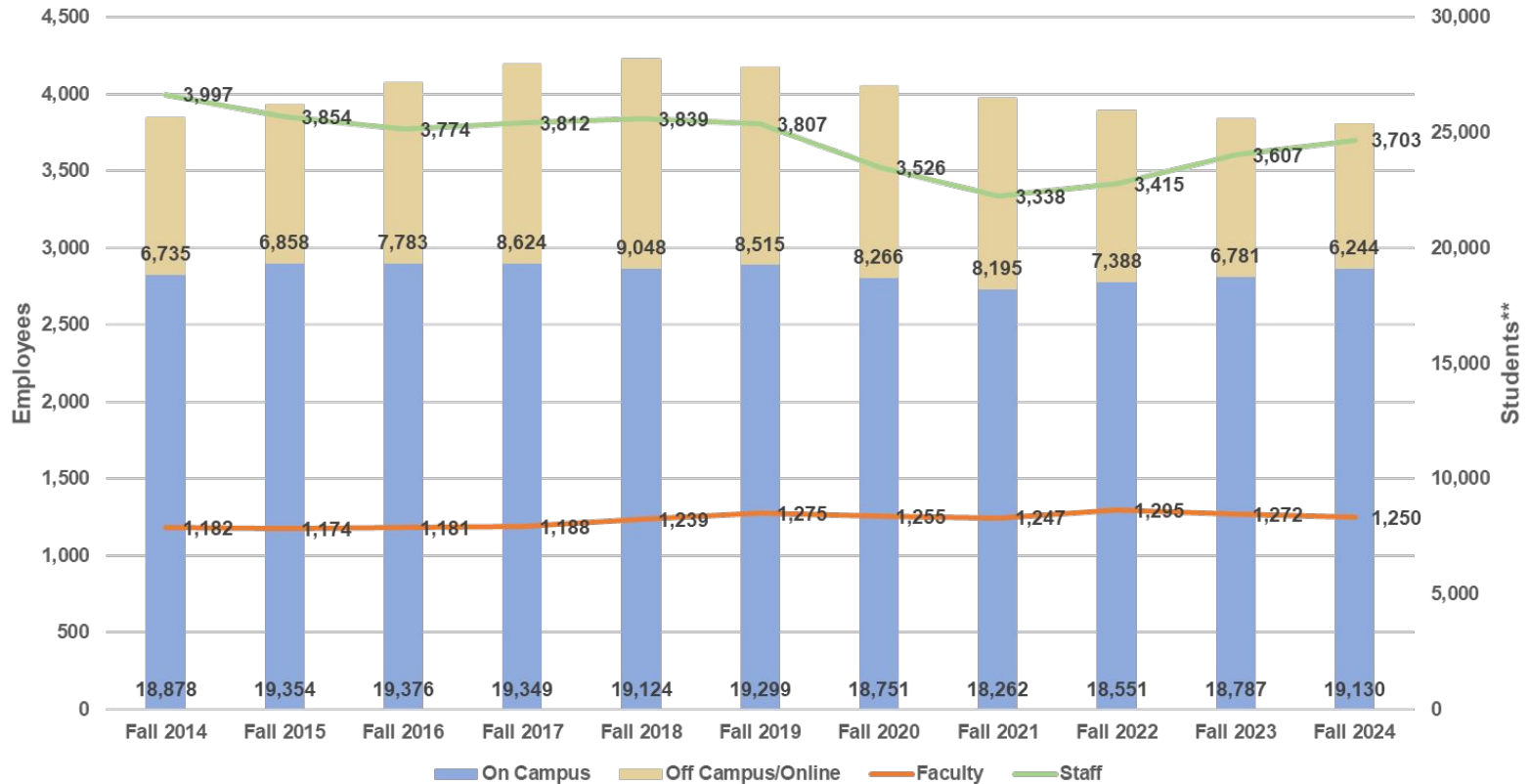

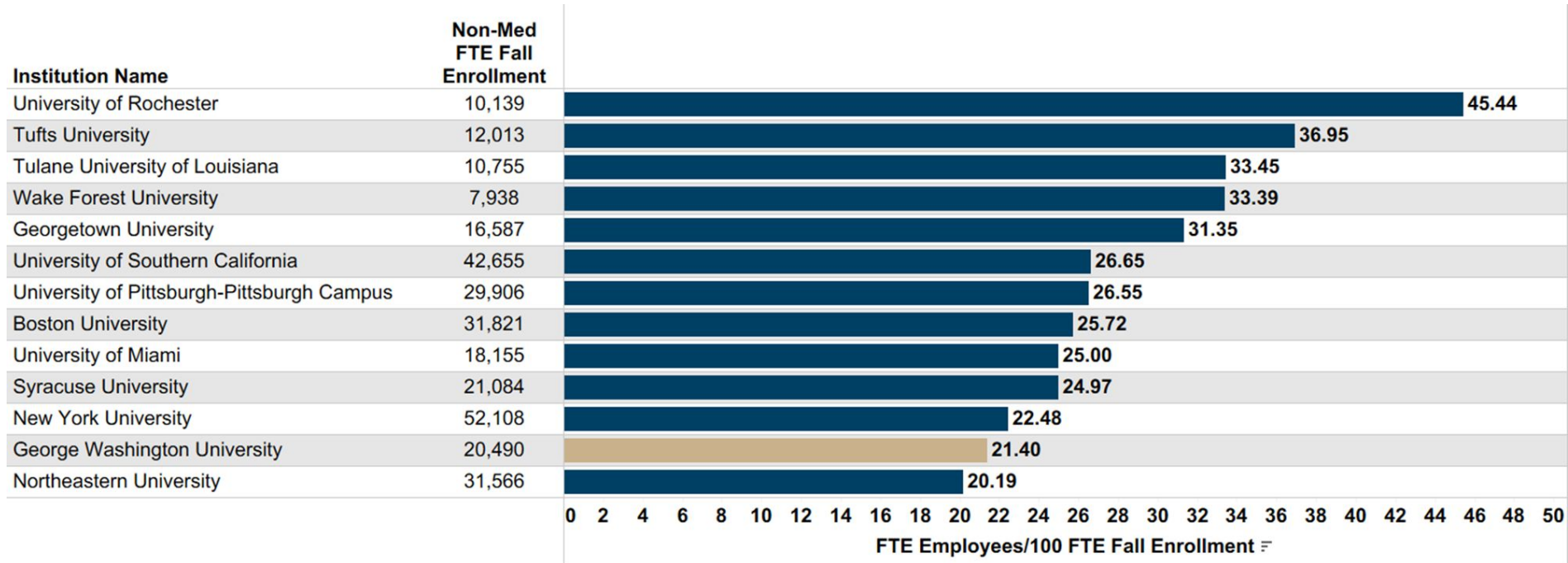
# Full-time Personnel and Total Student Headcount



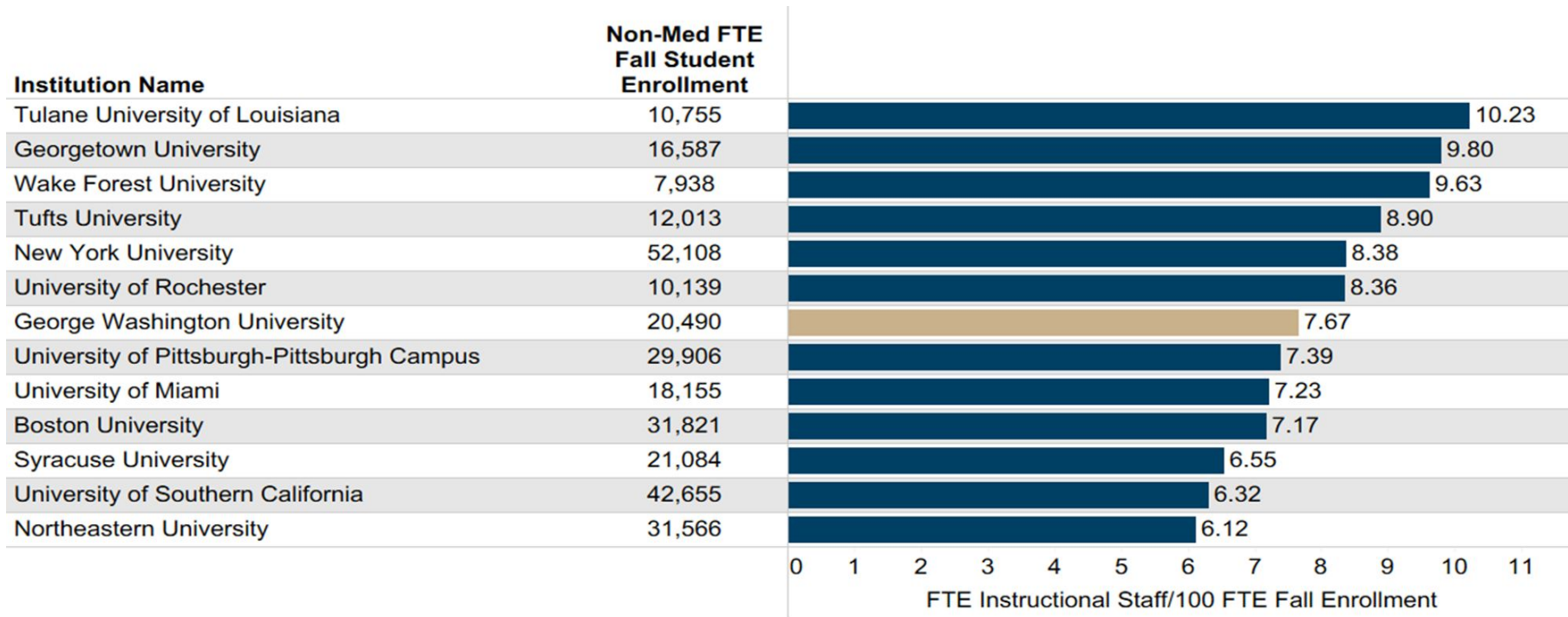
